Glossary of Terms	
Approved Subject	These are subjects and related standards that can be used to gain University Entrance.
Certificate Endorsement	Students gain certificate endorsement when they gain 50 or more credits at Merit or Excellence at the level of the certificate or higher.
Course Endorsement	Students gain an endorsement for a course if, in a single year, they achieve: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 14 credits or more at Merit or Excellence, where • at least 3 of these credits are from externally assessed standards and 3 credits from internally assessed standards.
Credits	Credits are awarded for each standard a student achieves (refer to page 6 regarding number of credits needed to pass NCEA Level 1, 2 and 3).
External Assessment	Assessment for externally assessed standards are set and marked by NZQA at the end of the year.
Further Tertiary Study	Any study undertaken beyond school at university, polytechnic or private training provider.
Gateway Programme	A programme for Year 12 and 13 students wanting to investigate an industry or workplace as well as gaining some credits. Work experience is also available to students. Visit the Careers Centre to find out more.
Internal Assessment	Internally assessed standards are set and marked by teachers in schools or consented providers throughout the year.
NZQA	The New Zealand Qualifications Authority administers the National Qualifications Framework (NQF), which is the official source for accurate and current information on quality assured qualifications in New Zealand.
Achievement Standards	Standards are the skills or knowledge students are expected to achieve or know in a course. Achievement Standards assess performance against the NZ Curriculum. They can be assessed internally or externally. For Achievement Standards you can get: Achieved (A) for a satisfactory performance, Merit (M) for very good performance, Excellence (E) for excellent performance, or Not Achieved (N) if you don't meet the requirements of the standard.
Unit Standards	Unit Standards assess performance specified by industry or tertiary organisations. They are assessed internally, and students can gain Achieved (A) or Not Achieved (N).
NZ Scholarship Exams	These are external assessments for only the most able students and run by NZQA. They are competitive monetary awards and not a qualification. NZ Scholarships are awarded to the top 2-3% of students in a subject at Level 3.
Other Scholarships and Awards	These are generally monetary awards to assist with continued study beyond school. Tertiary institutions and other organisations provide funds to schools, who make award decisions based on pre-determined criteria. Visit the Careers Centre to find out more.
University Entrance (UE)	University Entrance (UE) is the minimum requirement to go to a New Zealand university (see following page).
Vocational Pathways	Vocational Pathways is a Ministry of Education initiative designed to improve the relevance of learning for students. This happens through indicating how a student's learning and achievement is valued by employers in sectors of the workforce.

Minimum Requirements for University Entrance (UE)

A pass in NCEA Level 3 = 60 credits at Level 3 and 20 credits at Level 2 = 80 credits

This is made up of:

- 14 credits in each of three subjects from the list of university-approved subjects (see below) = 42 credits
- 18 credits from any other subjects and can be either Achievement or Unit Standards.
- UE Numeracy = 10 credits at Level 1 or higher from specified Achievement Standards or the 3 specific numeracy Unit Standards
- UE Literacy = 10 credits (5 in reading and 5 in writing) from specified Achievement Standards at Level 2 and higher; or specified Level 2 standards in Te Reo Māori

Most Universities ask for higher entry requirements than above. See their websites or ask our Careers Centre.

Auckland University's Literacy Requirement: From 2016 there is a new entrance requirement for domestic students. Those applying on the basis of NCEA results must have gained a minimum of 17 credits in English at Level 2 or 3.

New Zealand Scholarship Examinations (NZQA)

New Zealand Scholarships are external assessments for top students in their last year of schooling. They are competitive monetary awards and are designed to challenge the most capable Level 3 candidates.

Teachers can invite students to enter New Zealand Scholarship based on their academic performance and potential. Students can ask their teachers for guidance about the additional work and study requirements and whether or not they would be suitable candidates for entry.


Vocational Pathways



Vocational Pathways provides new ways for students to achieve NCEA Level 2. It aims to help students see how their learning and achievement is valued in the 'real world' by aligning NCEA Level 2 Assessment Standards with six industries.

Students must have gained NCEA Level 2 to receive a Vocational Pathways Award – 60 of these Level 2 credits must be from the recommended standards in one or more pathways, including 20 credits from sector-related pathways.

ENGLISH – LEVEL 1

01 English Academic	01ENA
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ENTRY:	Successful completion of the Year 10 English programme as well as the recommendation from your Year 10 English teacher. Final entry is subject to Head of Department approval.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	In this course you will cover creative and formal writing, literature study, speeches, close and wide reading and research.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 24 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 12 credits externally assessed • 12 credits internally assessed. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 English Academic: You need at least 15 credits from 01 English Academic, including all external standards, or approval of the Head of Department English. 02 English General: You will need the recommendation of the Head of Department English.
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	Nil.


01 English General	01ENG
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ENTRY:	Successful completion of the Year 10 English programme as well as the recommendation from your Year 10 English teacher. Final entry is subject to Head of Department approval.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	In this course you will cover core literacy skills, writing, literature study, close and wide reading and research. The course is predominantly internally assessed, with the possible inclusion of one external standard to allow Merit or Excellence endorsements.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 24 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 8 credits externally assessed • 16 credits internally assessed. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 English General (if you have achieved 15 credits); or 02 English Applied 1 (if you have achieved Level 1 Literacy).
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	Nil.

01 English Applied**01ENP**

ENTRY:	Your English teacher will recommend entry to this course and the Head of Department English will make the final decision.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	This course is based on the NZ Curriculum in English and is designed to cover the core literacy skills required for NCEA Level 1.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 13 credits, all internally assessed. Literacy Standards as needed, all internally assessed. There is no endorsement available for this course.
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 English General or 02 English Applied.
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	Nil.

MATHEMATICS – LEVEL 1

01 Mathematics Academic	01MAT
ENTRY:	In Year 10, you will need to have gained one Excellence in any topic, and Merit grades in 'Number', 'Algebra Manipulations' and 'Statistics' topic tests or end of year exams; and have Achieved grades in four other topic tests during the year; and have the approval of the Head of Department of Mathematics.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	This course develops mathematical thinking and problem solving skills, including: investigating relationships between tables, equations and graphs; using statistical methods to investigate chance and multivariate data; applying right-angled triangles to solve measurement problems; applying geometric reasoning and algebraic procedures to solve problems.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 23 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 12 credits externally assessed • 11 credits internally assessed. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Mathematics with Calculus (you should have gained a Merit grade in AS1.2 Algebra plus at least two other Merit grades in either AS1.1 Number, AS1.3 Graphs, or AS1.7 Trigonometry, with a minimum of 16 credits at L1 Mathematics); or 02 Mathematics with Statistics (you should have gained at least two Merit grades in AS1.13 Simulation or AS1.12 Chance and Data, and Merit in AS1.10 Multivariate or AS1.11 Bivariate with a minimum of 14 credits in Level 1 Mathematics).
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	Workbook \$20.00 Graphics calculator \$120.00 is recommended for this course


01 Mathematics Business	01MAB
ENTRY:	You should have an Achieved in AS90981; or Merit in the Year 10 Number topic test or the Number section in the Year 10 end-of-year exam, and an Achieved in the Year 10 Algebra topic test or the Algebra section of the Year 10 end-of-year exam.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	<p>You will study Mathematics standards which will give you Numeracy credits towards your Level 1 qualification. The mathematics standards have been selected to prepare you to take Level 2 Accounting and Economics as they are a combination of numerical, graphical and statistical standards.</p> <p>You will also study aspects of Accounting, which includes processing financial transactions for a business entity.</p>
ASSESSMENT:	<p>Achievement Standards up to 20 credits</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 credits externally assessed • 16 credits internally assessed. <p>NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).</p>
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Economics; or 02 Accounting; or 02 Statistics if you have achieved at least 14 credits in 01BUS.
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	Workbook \$20.00 Scientific calculator \$20.00

01 Mathematics General	01MAG
ENTRY:	In Year 10, you will need to have gained Achieved grades in the 'Number' and 'Algebra Manipulations' topic tests or end of year exams; and have Achieved grades in four other topic tests during the year; and have the approval of the Head of Department of Mathematics.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	This course develops the mathematical thinking and problem solving skills required as background knowledge for both the 02 Mathematics General and Applied courses. There will be an emphasis on learning statistical processes.
ASSESSMENT:	<p>Achievement Standards up to 20 credits</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 credits externally assessed • 16 credits internally assessed. <p>NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).</p>
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Mathematics Statistics (you should have gained at least two Merit grades in AS1.13 Simulation or 1.12 Chance and Data, and Merit in AS1.10 Multivariate or AS1.11 Bivariate, with a minimum of 14 credits in Level 1 Mathematics); or 02 Mathematics General (you should have Achieved at least five Achievement Standards); or 02 Enterprise Mathematics (you should have Achieved in at least five Achievement Standards); or 02 Vocational Mathematics (you will not have gained Level 1 Numeracy or NCEA Level 1, and will have the recommendation of both the Head of Department of Mathematics and the Level Dean.

01 Mathematics Applied	01MAP
ENTRY:	This course is for students who don't qualify for entry into either 01 Mathematics Academic or 01 Mathematics General.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	This course is designed for students who have some difficulty with mathematical skills and concepts and covers the core numeracy skills required for NCEA Level 1.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 14 credits. All internally assessed.
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Mathematics General (you need to have achieved all the Achievements Standards in the 01MAP course); or 02 Enterprise Mathematics (you should have gained Achieved in at least five Achievement Standards); or 02 Vocational Mathematics (you will not have gained Level 1 Numeracy or NCEA Level 1, and have the recommendation of both the Head of Department of Mathematics and the Level Dean.
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	Workbook \$20.00 Scientific calculator \$20.00

01 Accounting	01ACC
ENTRY:	You should have gained an Achieved in AS90981; or Merit in the Year 10 Number topic test or the Number section in the Year 10 end-of-year exam, and an Achieved in the Year 10 Algebra topic test or the Algebra section in the Year 10 end-of-year exam. If the prerequisites are not met, entry to 01 Accounting is at the discretion of the Head of Department.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	You will learn about processing transactions into the accounting records for a sole proprietor; preparing financial statements for a sole proprietor and for a community organisation; and interpreting the financial statements and making recommendations for improvement.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 18 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 9 credits externally assessed • 9 credits internally assessed. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Accounting if you have achieved at least 14 credits in 01ACC, including AS90977 and AS90978; or to have achieved Numeracy at Level 1 and a Merit in AS91001 or an Achieved in AS90977. If the prerequisites are not met, entry to 02 Accounting is at the discretion of the Head of Department.

SCIENCES - LEVEL 1



01 Science Academic [Biology/Chemistry and Physics/Chemistry]

01SCBC and 01SCPC

ENTRY:

01 Science Academic takes two option lines in your timetable: 01SCBC (Biology/Chemistry) and 01SCPC (Physics/Chemistry). This course is designed for students who are interested in continuing on with Science at Level 2 and 3, providing students with a broader platform for entry into Level 2 Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

01SCBC consists of aspects of biology and chemistry. The biology in this course covers the role of DNA in producing the wide variety of life on earth; how the unique organ structure of mammals allows them to gain the energy they need to survive; and many of the interactions between humans and micro-organisms. The chemistry in this course covers the uses and reactions of carbon-based compounds and fuels, and their effect on the environment. In addition, you will research the chemistry involved in an industrial process that takes place in New Zealand. 01SCPC consists of aspects of physics and chemistry. The physics in this course covers how mechanics (Newtonian Physics), and waves. The chemistry includes chemical reactions and roles of acids and bases in our everyday lives.

ASSESSMENT:

01SCBC: Achievement Standards up to 21 credits

- 11 credits externally assessed
- 8 credits internally assessed.

01SCPC: Achievement Standards up to 20 credits

- 12 credits externally assessed
- 8 credits internally assessed.

NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for these courses when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).

THIS COURSE LEADS TO:

The two courses will give you a broad base on which to progress to 02 Biology, 02 Physics, 02 Chemistry (you will need at least 12 credits with at least 8 of these from the specific specialization e.g. Biology, and 8 of which come from external standards); or 02 Science General (you will need at least 12 credits including 8 from external standards).



01 Science General	01SCG
ENTRY:	You need to have passed Year 10 Science and have the recommendation of your teacher.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	<p>This course covers the study of biology, chemistry, physics, geology, and astronomy. You will learn about how and why chemical reactions occur; how forces affect the motion of objects; and how genetics operates to make us all different and unique. You will also learn about how the Auckland volcanoes formed; why we have day, night and seasons on Earth; and the effect of heat on everyday objects.</p> <p>This course is co-constructed with students to suit their individual needs. Although the course will provide 20 credits, these credits could be gained from any combination of the Level 1 standards provided by the department, in consultation between the teacher, student, and parents.</p>
ASSESSMENT:	<p>Achievement Standards up to 20 credits</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 12-16 credits internally assessed • 8-12 credits externally assessed. <p>NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external and 3 from internal standard(s).</p> <p>Students can opt out of one or two externally assessed standards in favour of extra internal standards and a reduced load in the end of year exams. This is to be discussed with the teacher during the year.</p>
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	<p>02 Biology, 02 Physics and/or 02 Chemistry, if you get a pass at Merit or above in three standards (two of which should be externals), and with the approval of the Head of Department; or</p> <p>02 Science General.</p>
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	<p>Education Perfect Online Tool, annual fee \$30.00</p> <p>There may be an opportunity to extend learning with a field trip in this subject (\$20.00)</p>

01 Science Applied	01SCP
ENTRY:	Entry to this course is based on the recommendation of your Year 10 Science teacher.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	This course covers the study of biology, chemistry, physics, geology, and astronomy. This course is co-constructed with students to suit their individual needs. Although the course will provide 20 credits, these credits could be gained from any combination of the Level 1 standards provided by us, in consultation with the teacher, student and parents.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 24 credits, all internally assessed.
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Science Applied or 02 Science General if you gain Merit or above.
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	No Workbook required, but a device is essential.

SOCIAL SCIENCES – LEVEL 1

01 Geography	01GEO
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ENTRY:

An interest in Geography and the approval of the Social Science Head of Department.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

In this course you will learn about geographical skills and extreme natural events; specifically the 2010 Haiti earthquake and its impacts on both the cultural and natural environments. The course will also focus on geographic issues such as; global patterns of the illegal ivory trade as well as how to use environments sustainably. Through this course, you will develop skills in research, debating, understanding perspectives, interpreting evidence and essay writing.

ASSESSMENT:

Achievement Standards up to 21 credits

- 13 credits internally assessed
- 8 credits externally assessed.

NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).

THIS COURSE LEADS TO:

02 Geography (if you have at least 14 credits). Developing skills in research, interpreting and analysing geographic information; a greater knowledge and awareness of environmental issues.

STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):



01 History	01HIS
ENTRY:	An interest in History and the approval of the Social Science Head of Department.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	In this course you will learn about the themes of conflict and security in the 20 th century, both in a New Zealand and international context. You will cover threats to New Zealand's security and the development of the country's society and position on the international stage. We will explore the changing values and ideas that occurred during New Zealand's post World War 2 society. In term two, the focus will be on the origins of World War 2, looking at the rise of fascism and the international responses to this. Finally, in term three we will focus on learning to interpret different perspectives about a global, historic event. Through this course, you will develop skills in research, debating, understanding perspectives, interpreting historical evidence and essay writing.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 20 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 12 credits internally assessed • 8 credits externally assessed. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 History (if you have at least 14 credits). Developing skills in research, debating, understanding perspectives, interpreting historical evidence and essay writing.
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	There may be an opportunity to extend learning with a field trip in this subject (\$15.00)
01 Media Studies	01MED
ENTRY:	An interest in the course and the approval of the Teacher-in-Charge of Media Studies.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	In the course you will learn about development of 'New Media', focusing on theory and practice. You will have the opportunity to study and produce advertising and viral marketing, while working collaboratively with senior Media Studies students.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 19 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 15 credits internally assessed • 4 credits externally assessed. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Media Studies (if you have at least 14 credits).
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	8GB SD card \$20.00 8GB USB stick \$10.00
01 Social Science	01SOS
ENTRY:	To enter this course you need to have the approval of the Social Sciences Head of Department.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	This course offers an alternative to 01 Geography and 01 History. You will study a variety of topics linked to Geography, History and Social Studies including the factors and processes that result in the illegal ivory trade as well as learning about how social action groups were formed during the 1981 Springbok Tour of New Zealand.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 18 credits, all internally assessed.
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Social Science or 02 Travel and Tourism, as well as possible pathway into 03 Geography or 03 History, if adequate credits are gained.
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	Nil

01 Economics**01ECO**

ENTRY:	An interest in Economics and the approval of the Head of Social Science Department.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	This is a foundation course that covers the core economic concepts that are used to explain how markets work and how the forces of demand and supply determine the price of goods and services. This course is composed of three modules that are externally assessed. Module one provides an understanding of consumer choices and considers the impact that scarcity has on demand. The second module provides an understanding of producer choices and the impact that this has on supply. The final module considers how consumers and producers and/or government choices affect society and determine market equilibrium and affect the value of goods and services.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 24 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 12 credits externally assessed • 12 credits internally assessed. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Economics (if you have at least 14 credits)
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	Nil

PHYSICAL EDUCATION and HEALTH – LEVEL 1




01 Physical Education	01PED
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ENTRY:	Successful completion of the Year 10 PE and Health programme.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	In the theory part of 01 Physical Education you will learn about anatomy, skill learning, biomechanics and wellbeing, sports and fitness studies. 



01 Art	01ART

In this course you will develop your ideas from drawings to finished work using a wide variety of media such as basic photographic techniques, making digital images, controlling drawing, print, and painting media. Work is set around a given theme and is assessed at five different stages of the year to cover each of the Achievement Standards. Students have the opportunity to engage in different fields of the Visual Arts – Design, Photography, Printmaking and Painting.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 26 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 14 credits from internal assessment • 12 credits from external assessment. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Art: Painting or Printmaking or Design or Photography (if you have 80 credits at Level 1 NCEA including at least 18 credits from 01 Art) and/or Art History (if you have 80 credits at Level 1 NCEA). In recent years, the Visual Arts have grown enormously to become a multi-million dollar industry. There are now many career opportunities for tertiary and non-tertiary trained students. 01 Drama	01DRA
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ENTRY:	Successful completion of the Year 10 Drama programme.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	This course is an introduction to performance drama, techniques, and technologies. You will learn to combine voice and body to create character; write and perform your own scripts; study different forms of theatre and prepare an evening performance for family and friends.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 26 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 externally assessed credits • 22 internally assessed credits. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. 01 Music	01MUS
ENTRY:	Successful completion of the Year 10 Music programme, or have the approval of the Head of Department. You will also need to have a minimum of Grade 2 Theory or equivalent.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	In this course you will prepare solo and group performances, study composition/songwriting, musicianship, and musical knowledge. You must be actively learning an instrument either through the itinerant music lessons at school, or private music lessons. The expectation is that you will attend at least one instrumental or vocal lesson once a week.

01 Design and Visual Communication	01DVC


01 Fashion Design	01FDS
ENTRY:	You will have a real interest in fashion, fabrics and design.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	This course is a mixture of practical and theory. You will learn about technological processes associated with soft materials, and there will be two major projects: a short skills based project, aimed at building confidence in basic sewing procedures, this allows students to move forward into more advanced work in their second term. In the second project, students begin by creating a conceptual design, learning to work through the design process and visually communicate their ideas. This conceptual design is then developed through testing of techniques and made in full. There is also an external written report.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 22 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 credits externally assessed • 18 credits internally assessed. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s) and 3 from internal standard(s).
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Fashion Design (if you have achieved at least 14 credits).
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	Material costs \$75.00 (take home)

01 Construction	01CON
ENTRY:	Successful completion of the Year 10 Technology course, have an interest in construction, and you will have an interview with the teacher-in-charge of the subject.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	In this course you will gain experience in planning and managing materials and tools. You will work on carpentry and joinery projects and will complete theory worksheets to show subject knowledge. 01 Engineering**01EGR**

ENTRY:	Successful completion of the Year 10 Technology course, have an interest in engineering, and will have an interview with the teacher-in-charge of the subject.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	In this course you will work with engineering materials and techniques. The course focuses on knowledge of metals and the latest technology in engineering machinery and tools.



01 Food and Nutrition	01FAN
ENTRY:	You will have successfully completed Year 10 Food and Nutrition, or you will need to have an interview with the Head of Department of Home Economics.

Uniform for practical lessons must include covered shoes, an apron, hair net and/or chef's hat, no facial piercings, no false fingernails or nail polish are allowed.
ASSESSMENT:	Achievement Standards up to 19 credits <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 credits externally assessed • 15 credits internally assessed. NZQA will give you a Merit or Excellence endorsement for this course when you gain 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence. At least 3 of those 14 credits must be gained from external standard(s), and the rest from internal standard(s).
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Food and Nutrition - if you have achieved at least 14 credits.
STATIONERY & COURSE COSTS (approx.):	Workbooks \$35.00 Food ingredients \$100.00 You may be asked to bring some of your own ingredients when doing individual tasks.

01 Hospitality	01HOS
ENTRY:	Open entry.
COURSE DESCRIPTION:	This course introduces you to food and catering in the hospitality industry. It is practically-based with some theory. The course may cover hygiene and safe food practices, preparing fruit and vegetables, meat cookery, learning to cook with cakes and sponges in the Hospitality Industry. Also learning how to use, store and carry knives safely, as well as learning about workplace health and safety. You will need to be able to follow instructions carefully, and you will develop important organisational and self-management skills. This is a totally internally assessed Unit Standard course. Uniform for practical lessons must include covered footwear, an apron, hair net and/or chef's hat, no facial piercings, no false fingernails or nail polish are allowed.
ASSESSMENT:	Unit Standards up to 26 credits, all internally assessed
THIS COURSE LEADS TO:	02 Hospitality This is the first step towards the New Zealand Certificate in Hospitality and will lead to a qualification in cookery at tertiary level. It contributes towards the Vocational Pathways Service Sector credits. Leads to careers in the Hospitality Industry, tourism, hotel management/work, café work, restaurant work.






